# MARGARET WILLIAMS RESEARCH GRANTS FOR BOTANICAL RESEARCH

The Nevada Native Plant Society (NNPS) Margaret Williams research grants program will annually award up to two grants of not over \$1,000 each.

These grants are designed to facilitate basic botanical research and increase our understanding of Nevada's native and naturalized flora. The research should cover some aspect of our flora from single species to whole communities or ecosystems. Research can include, but is not limited to, disciplines such as conservation, landscape analysis, ecology, biogeography, or taxonomy.

## CRITERIA AND PROCEDURES

Written proposals are to be submitted to the Small Grants Program chair. Research proposals should be clear and concise and should contain:

- A title
- Objectives
- Methods
- Expected final product
- A brief statement of applicant's qualifications
- A project budget for how the grant funds will be spent

If applicant is a student, an accompanying letter from their advisor is required (maximum of one page). Inclusion of an e-mail address will facilitate notification. Deadline is February 1, 2016.

Costs covered by these grants include travel, lodging, meals, services such as computer time, graphics, phone, copying, and film and processing. Non-eligible costs include equipment, wages, typing, and costs unrelated to the project.

A decision will be reached by March 1, 2016. All applicants will be notified of the committee's decision. The committee may decide not to fund a grant in any given year.

Successful applicants will be required to discuss their research results with NNPS. This can be through an article for our newsletter or by giving a presentation at an evening NNPS meeting.

Support in the form of a NNPS Margaret Williams Grant will be awarded only once for any one project.

Proposals must be emailed or postmarked by February 1, 2016 to be eligible.

# CALIFORNIA NATIVE PLANT SOCIETY BRISTLECONE CHAPTER DEDECKER BOTANICAL GRANTS

Grants are for research and projects that increase the understanding and appreciation of native plants and ecosystems in the Eastern Sierra and are available to graduate students, college students, and primary and secondary students (K-12). Research projects need not be academic or scholarly but must be relevant to the native plants of the northern Mojave Desert, Sierra Nevada, and Great Basin portions of eastern California. Applications must include written support from a major advisor or teacher.

Grant recipients receive up to \$1,000 each for expenses and are asked to present their results to the Bristlecone Chapter either at a regular meeting or in the chapter newsletter. The deadline for the 2016 Grant is January 22, 2016. All applicants will be notified of the committee's decision by early March, 2016.
